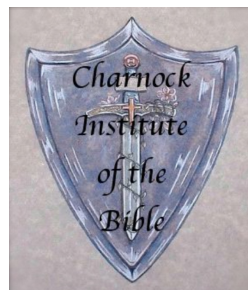

Entrance Requirements

It is important to note that entrance into CIB requires that a potential student be:

- Competent: A High School diploma will not get you into CIB. You must display the ability to do the work and carry the load. CIB has a difficult but doable curriculum.
- Willingness: This means you can submit to authority. Not that you are

perfect, but rather that you admit weaknesses (which we all have) and work to overcome them when they are addressed.

- Ministry: All students must participate in ministry the entire time they are at CIB. You must come to serve!
