

However, true translation involves much more. Being a technical translator does not mean that one can actually read the Greek or Hebrew text. It simply means one can use the tools. But true understanding requires a reading ability like one reads in his native language. Greek and Hebrew are not English! In fact they are nothing like English! Students have told us that they were told that they do not need the Languages of the Bible. That translations have come so far now that there is really no need for further study in this area. They reject this view as amazingly ignorant in the first week; because Ignorant It Is! This makes their Bible Study truly INDUCTIVE from the original languages themselves. This causes many problem passages to disappear. It causes them to see the actual Biblical words in their actual context so they can observe word meanings for themselves, rather than looking them up in a Lexicon with absolutely no context to help them.

Another CIB distinctive is a complete reading of the Ante-Nicene Fathers. The title simply means the Early Church Writers up to the Council at Nice in a.d. 325. Students spend three years getting through these at about 60 pages a week. They attend classes each week to discuss their findings. This also creates an INDUCTIVE education. After all, no one is telling them what the early Church wrote, taught and believed; they are reading this for themselves. There is no competent text out there that can give them this! All of the materials must be read. Then discussion in class helps everyone polish their perspectives. This is an amazing journey! By the way, we do not teach a specific class in Systematically Theology at CIB. The Early Church Writings ARE the Systematic Theology! Though modern terminology may not be found there, neither will the Early Church's Theology be found here. Come see for yourself.

These items above are the reason for the creation of Charnock Institute of the Bible. A New Venture, A New Curriculum, A New Education unlike any known before. Students beginning their Ministries with a Biblical Foundation like no other rather than spending a lifetime in ministry trying to figure out what the Greek and Hebrew actually mean, and which Doctrines are new and which are actually old.
