

NEW SYRIAC COURSE

Beginning in September 2017, CIB will be offering a new Syriac Course. The entire Bible was translated into Syriac just as the Apostles passes from the scene. It offers several benefits:

- 1. It is the first Bible made after the Apostles.
- 2. It was translated by Jews who had come to faith. There is the consideration that the Old Testament could have been translated by non-believing Jews.
- 3. It provides the earliest opportunity to see how the Bible was being read and interpreted by the first Christians and by Jews who put the New Testament a language very similar to Hebrew.
- 4. You will be surprised to see how they read and understood multiple passages from both of the Testaments. Interpretation is very much a part of all translation; so here is your chance to see, without modern views, what they saw.
- 5. The Syriac Course will be part of a Master's Degree at

CIB. A Two Semester Course.

NEW COPTIC COURSE

Like the Syriac, the COPTIC was the 2nd Translation made of the Bible. COPTIC means Egyptian. When the Egyptians moved away from their hieroglyphs ("Sacred Carvings") they used a script created by using the Capital Greek Letters with the addition of 6 new letters of their own making. While only the New Testament is available presently, the Old Testament is being put together from its many scattered manuscripts and is not due for publishing for some time. However, the Old Testament portions are actually taken from the Septuagint (LXX) which is the Greek Translation of the Hebrew Text a couple of hundred years before Jesus arrived on the scene. It was NOT a good translation, but was the Bible of the Early Church; and even of portions of the Latin Vulgate. It offers several benefits:

- 1. It is the second Bible made shortly after the time of the Apostles.
- 2. We see the reading of those in Christianity. How they read, translated, and interpreted the New Testament at that time.
- 3. You will see Translation Practices into the Egyptian language and culture.
- 4. The COPTIC will be a One Semester Course with a possible 2nd Semester

Course of pure Translation of New Testament Texts.

TEXTUAL CRITICISM

Did you know that Textual Criticism is a field of study that few Christians ever participate in. It requires multiple language studies and the Languages needed are normally NOT offered at Bible Colleges and Seminaries. For Biblical Studies it requires Greek, Hebrew, Aramaic, and Latin. These ARE the all classes at CIB and students participate in Textual Criticism courses in their final year at CIB. Syriac and Coptic will add two more Languages to this important area of study for those completing the first four languages.
